THE NETWORK PROGRAM

Thanks to its Therapeutic Prison Communities and Community Reentry Program, Network has consistently been recognized as one of the most effective agencies in the field, understanding and giving form to the vital connection between "in custody" care and "in community" preparation and follow-up. That the Network approach works can be seen from its 3year recidivism rate of 7% compared to 40% for New York State and 75% for the nation as a whole.

NETWORK PROGRAM GOALS

- Responsibility for self
- Responsibility to others
- Responsibility for the quality of one's own life
- Responsible for the life of one's community

To make responsible decisions, individuals need to consider their own wants and needs and also how these affect others. Responsible behavior comes from understanding the difference between wants and needs and appropriate ways to get those needs met. Criminal behavior and alcohol or substance abuse are dysfunctional attempts to satisfy needs.

Network members know that a sense of self-worth leads to a crime-free and productive life. The Network Program is designed to instill respect for self and others and focuses on helping formerly-incarcerated men and women adjust to community living.

SUPPORT MEETINGS

Individuals coming home from prison are welcomed to NETWORK therapeutic support meetings at six New York City sites where they are assisted on the next leg of the journey towards a productive and more rewarding life. The meetings offer support and guidance and are led by formerly incarcerated men and women who have built new lives, are doing well in their careers, and who enjoy the respect and friendship of their neighbors and colleagues. They have "walked the walk," they are walking tall, and they are only too happy to point you in the right direction
